Drone sightings!

Luminier, one of America's largest drone manufacturers has reached out to the MCRC via V.P. Sean Sutton and most of their employees have joined! The enjoy the fact that they can practice in our recently added helidrone section and our fully electrified flying site. When they wish to fly in our regular flying area, they will adhere to the "racetrack" pattern if there are fixed wing planes operating and will have a spotter if comingling with fixed wing aircraft. Luminier also puts on commercial light shows and their first evening practice session on the 26th was SPECTACULAR! About 30 drones were airborne and the light display was pretty cool!

The Board has had in depth discussions about not only Luminier's drone flying but drone flying in general. If a drone pilot wishes to fly with the fixed wing aircraft they must have a spotter and must follow the "racetrack" flight pattern. Should a drone wish to "exercise" one with a fully aerobatic flight from the main flight line he or she should ask fixed wing flyer's permission to fly over the main runway (just as has been MCRC policy with heli's) when fixed wing flights terminate theirs. Remember that we do this for fun and
